**Christian Folk Musician, Bruce King to Help Tune-Out Hunger!**

Bruce King, a local Christian folk music singer/songwriter will help East Fort Bend Human Needs Ministry, Inc. Tune-Out Hunger at their annual fundraiser in October. Bruce King will be the special musical guest at the charity luncheon which will raise money for the various programs the Ministry provides. Bruce plays original Christian folk songs with lyrical depth and quality acoustic guitar playing. Bruce was thankful for being asked to take part in the Tune-Out Hunger charity luncheon. *"I would love to contribute my time and talent for such a worthy cause,"* said Bruce when asked to play.

While Bruce has been writing songs and playing guitar for almost 30 years, it has been within the last three that he began writing and performing as a solo Christian folk artist. Last November he played at several Borders Bookstores, where you can find his current CD titled, *Catch Me with Your Grace*, but mostly, he plays at churches and other Christian venues. Bruce collaborated with other talented artists on this CD. Max Dyer, who plays cello for the Houston Grand Opera Orchestra; Dennis Whitiker, bassist with the Houston Symphony; Chase Jenkins, keyboards; Howard Dierking, percussion; Jason Koch, lead guitar; Tara Leigh Cobble, back up vocals; Bill Knapik, piano; and Daryl Parish, bass guitar.

Bruce also has extensive theatrical experience, including having been a stage actor in New York. A New York Times review of the stage show *Man Enough* gives Bruce a 'thumbs up' with this quote: *"Mr. King infuses Joey [Bruce's role] with a dignity and humanity that goes to the heart of good acting."* While performing is not Bruce's primary career, his long-term goal is to be able to support himself completely playing his music at churches throughout the country. Bruce is a chiropractor and practices in Houston along with his wife, who is also a chiropractor.
